



Dual Registration Agreement between the Scottish Youth FA and Approved Scottish FA Pyramid Associations (below) and the Scottish Junior Football Association.

- **Scottish Junior Football Association**
  - **Scottish Lowland Football League (including Lowlands Development League)**
  - **East of Scotland Football League**
  - **South of Scotland Football League**
  - **West of Scotland Football League**
1. The parties to this agreement are the Scottish Youth FA (SYFA) and the above-listed associations and leagues, henceforth referred to as 'approved organisations'
  2. This agreement will be binding on all member clubs and registered players of the SYFA and approved organisations and shall be reviewed in full on an annual basis.
  3. Any communications between member clubs of both Associations must only be carried out by the registered secretary of both clubs.
  4. The delayed transfers are to be registered using a Player Transfer Form which is available from both Associations. The form must contain all the player's details and be signed by the player and both clubs. The fully completed form must be submitted via the organisation's registration process within three days of signing.
  5. A player aged 18 or over, from an SYFA member team may also register for any team in membership of an approved organisation, with the transaction being completed via the registration method of "delayed transfer". This permits the player to play in competitive matches for both teams.
  6. A player aged 16 or 17, from an SYFA member team may also register with a team in membership of an approved organisation, so long as both fall under the same parent club's structure, with the transaction being completed via the registration method of "delayed transfer". This permits the player to play in competitive matches for both teams.

7. Clubs can apply for special dispensations to allow goalkeepers at ages 16 and 17 to register with teams under different parent club structures.
8. Any club in membership of an approved association (listed above) who wish to play an SYFA registered player must firstly obtain the permission of the SYFA club in writing, from the club secretary. Failure to gain written approval will result in the player being ineligible to participate.
9. In the event of a fixture clash, National Scottish Youth FA Cup games must take priority over all other fixtures.
10. The prioritisation of any other fixture clashes must be agreed by both clubs before signing the player transfer form.
11. Any club which fails to recognise this agreement by playing a player without the written consent of both clubs may be fined a sum commensurate with the infringement.
12. All cases of contravention of this agreement shall be reported to the association concerned.
13. It will be incumbent on the association making a complaint to conduct a full enquiry before doing so, to ensure that frivolous claims are not put forward.
